COMMENTS FROM THE TRAINER

We have been conducting CEM Exam Review Courses continuously since 1996 under the name Advanced Strategies. In 2003 we formed Zenitech Environmental, LLC. Zenitech Environmental is a woman-owned small business.

We have run classes ranging in length from 2 to 3 days, sometimes right before the exam, sometimes a few weeks out. What we have found is that most class attendees prefer a shorter, more intense course, just before the exam, with one to three days to study on their own between the review course and the exam. We usually hold the course in the same city as the exam is being offered; this allows people who are traveling to the exam to make just one trip.

Due to some changes in the exam format, namely the reduction of the number of multiple choice questions and the elimination of the longhand essays, we believe that two energizing days is sufficient time for us to cover our 250+ page manual. However, please be sure to review the topics outlined below prior to class.

FAQs

Q: What's on the exam?

A: These are the major exam subjects:

- ▶ **Hazardous Waste**
- ▶ **Treatment Technologies**
- ▶ **USTs and State Petroleum Fund**

Q: How long does the exam last?

A: Usually four hours, starting at 9 am and going until 1 pm. Observe updated information from the Certification Branch as specifics can change.

Q: How is the exam structured?

A: There are 200-300 multiple choice questions. Among these are general multiple choice questions (Part I) and groups of questions based on understanding scenarios (Part II). There are also a few true/false questions. The exam has been scientifically developed and is continually improved upon based on statistical analysis of the questions and answers.

Q: Do I really need this course?

A: The exam covers a broad range of environmental consulting topics. Unless you have an unusually broad subject knowledge, lengthy career experience, and expertise in exam taking, you will find this course to be of great importance in succeeding on the exam.

Q: What are the hardest parts of the exam?

A: Well, that depends on your background. Most people need extra study on RCRA waste determinations and management, the State UST program, groundwater rules, CEM certification rules, risk assessment and emergency response. We cover these subjects in focused detail in the CEM Exam Review Session.

Q: What's in your course?

A: In addition to the exam subjects listed above, we also build confidence and exam taking skills by reviewing:

Q: Can I obtain the manual early?

A: Yes, but you must register for the class and remit full payment plus an additional \$75 to cover printing, shipping and handling. If you opt for the advance manual, the course and book fees are non-refundable. The manual is designed to accompany classroom instruction and is not available separately from the course.

Q: Where should I stay?

A: Henderson is just southeast of [McCarran International Airport](#) and the [Las Vegas Strip](#).
